



What is Career Pathways?

Career Pathways is a state funded program that can assist eligible students with the academic and financial obstacles that they may face while going to school. Career Pathways can also assist those who are not enrolled in college courses with a variety of service such as the Career Readiness Certificate and other skills to help in the workforce.

To Be Eligible: (You do NOT have to be enrolled in college courses)

- You must be a parent, with children under 21 living in your home **AND**
- Meet income guidelines or one of the following:
- You must be receiving Transitional Employment Assistance (TEA) currently or formerly **OR**
- You must be receiving food stamps, Medicaid (ARKids included) **OR**
- You must have annual family income below 250% of federal poverty level
