

President's Report

College Governance

- Construction and renovation projects are coming to a close. The new building in Ash Flat is looking very good. It is scheduled to be completed by July 18 and we have scheduled delivery of furnishings and installation on July 22. The renovation of the old LPN building on the Melbourne campus into a new bookstore and offices is in its final phases and hopes to be complete in two weeks. The kitchen renovations are completed with new paint, flooring, ceiling tile, and some updated equipment.
- The foundation golf tournament in Mountain View was a great success. I enjoyed playing in the tournament with my team placing 15th out of 17 teams. The tournament raised nearly \$7000 for scholarships.
- Around the country, a great deal of discussion is taking place into restructuring work weeks to offset some of the economic impact caused by fuel prices. In higher education, much discussion and change is taking place in class scheduling to accommodate students. Many institutions have been operating on a four day class schedule and many more are moving that direction. We will be looking hard at a four day class schedule for the spring 2009 semester. I emphasize this will be a four day class schedule but the college will still operate on a five day work week for employees.
- Discussions have been conducted with the mayor of Mountain View and with the Stone County judge in regard to future buildings and the need for some type of tax support for the college. These discussions will continue with other members and groups in the community.
- The college has received numerous compliments on the buildings and grounds of the campus in Melbourne. The grounds department has done an excellent job with trees, shrubs, mowing, and signage to make the campus very attractive. The maintenance department has completed several significant building improvements and accomplished a great deal already this summer.

- Ozarka College was a major participant in the Melbourne Relay for Life activities. Over 65 employees and students participated in the all night event. The college group raised just under \$2000 for the event.
- The college had successfully completed the 2007-2008 fiscal year with all financial reports submitted to the state.

Instruction

- Dr. DeLong is continuing to work with the Arkansas Craft Guild and the Ozark Folk Center to develop the Arkansas Craft School. A Letter of Intent will be sent to ADHE for an Associate of Arts and Certificate program in Professional Craft.
- The LPN program was reviewed by the Arkansas Board of Nursing on June 20. The official results will not be available until September, but unofficially, the program is doing very well and the reviewer was very pleased with the direction and leadership of the program. The students in the 11 month programs are very satisfied with the program and instructors overall and looking forward to graduation in August.
- We have completed the reorganization of Academic Affairs moving from 5 divisions to 4. The new divisions and the areas of responsibility are as follows:

- Career Pathways staff continue to visit Mountain View and Ash Flat to meet with students who are enrolled for summer classes
- Campus building directory signs are set with assistance from grounds department

Grants/Planning/Special Projects

- The Perkins grant proposal for 2008-2009 has been submitted and includes a request to partially cover the Student Success Specialist and Student Success Center as it did in 2007-2008 and adds an Assistant Student Success Specialist in Ash Flat. In addition, funds are requested for professional development for student success leadership and for college-wide professional development associated with student success.
- The Perkins grant sponsored a group trip to National Parks Community College in Hot Springs and returned with additional ideas associated with increasing retention and completion. The group summarized these ideas and sent them to all college employees. Prior to the beginning of the fall semester, the Student Success Specialist will review the information generated from this trip and the two other Perkins sponsored trips in 2007-2008, analyze the progress made thus far and make recommendations for the fall semester to the Administrative Council for additional processes to consider for adoption.
- The Partners grant provided \$100 scholarships to the Ash Flat LPN students for the summer session.

- The DOJ grant will conclude in July and women's advocacy will continue through the Planning/Special Projects Department.
- The Crisis Manual has been updated and is being printed for fall distribution.
- The Planning Results Manual for 2007-2008 is about two-thirds completed.
- Binders with examples of model self-studies were made available to members of the Steering Committee in preparation for the up-coming accreditation visit in 2011.
- The Director of Planning and Special Projects was invited by the National Science Foundation to participate as a grant reviewer for NSF CCLI grant proposals and will take part in July as a reviewer to increase her grant writing skills.

Finance/Auxiliary Services

- The kitchen renovation has been completed. The old flooring was replaced with new tiles, the walls were painted, and new ceiling tiles were installed.
- New copiers have been installed at all campuses. Campus wide copier codes have been issued to employees and will be effective July 1st.

DRJ Closing Comments
