- The Budget is progressing to the final stages. A copy will be mailed to you with the packet for the Board Meeting.
- The Ozarka Kids Academy celebrated Arkansas Children's Week the 3rd week in April. Several of their campaigns included Support Your Troops, Recycling and Plant a Tree. As a part of Patriot's Day, donations were accepted and care packages were put together to send to the troops. Recycling bins were placed at the Kid's Academy and everyone was invited to participate. Two trees were also planted at the daycare to promote Earth Day.

Physical Plant/Grounds
