College Governance

- Discussion has been started with the Mountain View and Stone County area about the new facilities to be built at the Mountain View site. Discussion will continue in order to educate the residents of the possibilities and needs for the College and community.
- New programs are being researched for implementation beginning with Continuing Education courses which will help gauge the needs of our service area.
- The Self-Study committees are meeting and working to gather data and write the first draft of the report.
- Research is being conducted to determine possible solutions to allow Ozarka College to have a larger presence in Fulton County. The current plan is to offer general education evening classes at Mammoth Spring, Salem and Viola High Schools.
- The annual Ozarka College Golf Tournament was held at Cooper's Hawk Golf Course in Melbourne on September 26. 28 teams played in the 4-person scramble tournament. The tournament netted over \$10,000 for the Foundation.

Instruction

- Working with Developmental Education to enhance our developmental courses and to include COMPASS as an exit exam per the new state law ACT 971 which requires exit exams for all college developmental classes.
- The Arkansas Craft School Board of Directors has hired Mrs. Terri Van Orman as the new Executive Director replacing Dr. Wright Pillow.
- Dr. Dawe, Ron Helm, and Dr. DeLong met with the administration of Mammoth Spring and Thayer High Schools to discuss the possibility of offering classes at Mammoth Spring High School in the spring. The administration of Mammoth Spring High School offered their facilities to host the classes, and both agreed it would be great for their communities. Meetings were also conducted with Salem and Viola administrations. Dr. DeLong will discuss this with the Division Chairs as we develop the spring and summer schedules.
- Academic Affairs has purchased a Classroom Response System (clickers) to enhance the assessment of student learning in the classroom. Training for the instructors will be September 29 in the Lecture Hall.

Grants/Planning/Special Projects

- The Planning Results Manual has been posted on the website.
- The Five Criteria subcommittees are currently researching data for the Ozarka Self-Study for accreditation. The first draft is expected to be completed at the end of December.
- The Perkins grant has had over 140 tutoring sessions thus far this year, putting us in line to surpass the yearly goal of 450 tutoring sessions.
- The Partners for Care grant has nearly 50 high school students and 16 Ozarka students taking CNA classes this semester and 20 Ash Flat students taking LPN classes.

- Rachel Pennywitt with Hughes, Welch and Millgan, CPA firm was on campus Sept. 21 to conduct the 2008-2009 audit for the Ozarka College Foundation.
- Financial aid disbursements for Pell and student loans during the month exceeded \$2.5 million.

Information Systems

- Added security cameras with 440 hours of recording time on the Melbourne and Mountain View locations. Equipment for Ash Flat has been received and will be installed soon.
- Installed push-to-talk/push-to-record microphones in the board room to provide high quality audio recordings of the public board of trustee meetings.
- On Sunday Sept. 13 the main transformer providing power to the administration building blew. Entergy had a crew on-site within minutes and they worked through the night and into Monday morning replacing the transformer and the power line from the road into the campus. At 9:40 a.m. on Monday the power was restored to the building.

- Added the ability for faculty to easily contact their students using announcements in myOzarka that are posted on each course page and can be sent via email/txt to the students in each course section.
- Installed amplifier and speaker system in the dining room - Administration building to provide sound evenly distributed around the room for events. An external lapel microphone is hooked up to the system to provide the speaker with an option to reach the entire room.
- Continued to work with faculty and staff in preparing for the self-study in 2011.

- Leaks have developed at the Ash Flat site - Tate Construction is fixing those leaks at the Student Center/Nursing building.
