

Higher Learning Commission Visits Next Month

Ozarka College is quickly approaching the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) visit that will take place November 15 through 17. With just a month left before the visit, plans are being finalized with the HLC Evaluation Team. The Team is composed of four peer reviewers who have positions in community colleges similar to Ozarka. Each member of the Team has received a copy of the Ozarka College Self-Study to evaluate along with the e-Resource Room that is linked to the CD of the document. While the Team is on campus, the members will hold meetings with various Ozarka groups and persons to authenticate the Self-Study and the process that generated it. Soon, the Team Chair will send Dr. Dawe a guide for Ozarka to build a schedule for these meetings.

Vice President for Planning and Institutional Research, Joan Stirling states, "On November 17, the Team will conduct an exit interview probably sometime between 9:00 am and 10:00 a.m. prior to leaving. At the exit interview, the Team will inform us of the content of their report to HLC that will include their recommendations on accreditation for the College and the strengths and challenges noted."

After several online cultural exchanges between Ozarka College and Gorno Altaysk State University (GASU) in Siberia last Spring, the institutions have officially entered into an Agreement of Cultural, Educational and Scientific Cooperation.
