"These tests measure academic skills in reading, writing and mathematics. They were designed to provide comprehensive assessments that measure the skills and content knowledge of candidates entering teacher preparation programs." (https://www.ets.org/praxis/about)

Why do I need to take the PRAXIS?

- Passing the Praxis is a typical requirement for admission into a BSE program at a 4-year school
- Many states require Praxis Core scores as part of their licensing process

When, how, and where can I test?

Testing sites in central Arkansas include Harding College in Searcy, ASU Newport, and UCA in Conway. For northern county residents, West Plains, MO is an option. For a complete list, enter your zip code in the testing site search field found on http://www.ets.org/praxis/register/centers_dates/

You should attempt the PRAXIS I during your sophomore year in the ASE program, and no later than early in your last semester of your ASE program if you do not want to be delayed starting at your 4-year school.

How much does the test cost?
