Johnston Named President at Ozarka



Ozarka College officials announced in mid-December the appointment of Dr. Dusty R. Johnston as President of Ozarka College in Melbourne, Arkansas by the Ozarka College Board of Trustees unanimously in November of 2005. Dr. lohnston, a native of Shamrock, Texas, assumed the Presidency on January 3, 2006.

Johnston brings 23 years of experience working in the community college setting to Ozarka, including six years as an instructor and 17 years as an administrator. Most recently, he served as Dean of Instruction at Rich Mountain Community College in Mena, Arkansas for eight years. Prior to working as the chief academic officer for RMCC, Johnston spent 15 years with Howard College in Big Spring, Texas as an administrator and faculty member.

Dr. Johnston received his doctor of education degree in higher education from Texas Tech University in 1990. He also earned a bachelor's and master's degree in agriculture education from Texas

Ozarka's Spring Enrollment Increases

Spring enrollment at Ozarka College increased for 2006 over last year's numbers as indicated by final registration figures. After reaching a record spring enrollment in 2004 of 943 students, and last year's numbers taking a slight decrease, student enrollment for the current Spring semester totals 941.

Scholarship Opportunities at Ozarka College

The Ozarka College Admissions Office announces the scholarship opportunities available at Ozarka College during the Fall 2006 semester. Application deadlines are quickly approaching for these stipends. Along with numerous national, regional and state-level scholarships, there are several scholarships that are exclusive to Ozarka College and its service area.

First National Banking Company (FNBC) \$4,000 scholarship is available to an Ozarka College student within the FNBC service area. The scholarship recipient is awarded \$1,000.00 for tuition, fees and/or books for their first semester of attendance at Ozarka. The FNBC scholarship will then be renewed up to three semesters providing the student completes 12 credit hours each semester with a minimum grade point average of 2.75. The deadline to apply is April 20th.

The John E. Miller scholarship, which was established by the Batesville Area Chamber of Commerce in 1998, awards a \$500 per semester scholarship to an Ozarka College student. The stipend may be renewed for up to three semesters as long as the recipient is enrolled full-time and maintains at

The Walter B. Hall Scholarship is available to an Ozarka College student. Dr. Hall was the first director of Ozarka when the institution first opened its doors to students as a vocational-technical school in 1973. Dr. Hall served as Director of Ozarka from 1973 until his retirement in 1987. Hall's wife, Jean Halbrook Hall, worked as the counselor at the college for some time and still resides in Melbourne. The deadline for this \$250 stipend for Fall 2006 is April 20th.

The English Department at Ozarka College is awarding its seventh annual writing competition scholarship to two high school seniors in Izard, Fulton, Sharp, and Stone counties. These students will be selected as winners of writing competition and will each be awarded a one-year, full tuition scholarship to Ozarka College.
