

Federal Pell Grant

Federal Pell Grant is awarded to help Undergraduate students pay for their education after high school. For the Federal Pell Grant Program, an undergraduate is one who has not earned a bachelor's or professional degree. These Grants provide a "foundation" of financial aid for many students to which aid from other federal sources may be added.

The maximum amount awarded depends on the student's Student Aid Index (SAI) derived from the FAFSA, the cost of attendance (COA), enrollment status, and whether or not a student attends for the full academic year or less. Students who have all their paperwork in order in the Financial Aid office and who qualify for Pell Grant will be paid after the 11th day of classes. These funds will be posted to the student's myOzarka account and after any debt owed to Ozarka, refunds will be available the following Thursday after 12 PM.
