College Update from President Dr. Dawe

Thankfully spring is upon us in the beautiful Ozarks and we are preparing for commencement and already making plans for summer. We have had an outstanding academic year, and after celebrating a very successful evaluation visit from a team of the Higher Learning Commission's North Central Association, we are now focusing on potential new programs and developing a Facilities Master Plan.

Programs being considered include a Criminal Justice and Corrections Associate Degree; Certificate Program in Diesel Technology; and an Associate Degree and Certificate in Tourism and Hospitality Management. The Facilities Master Plan will involve a diverse committee representing the college community as we consider physical plant requirements to support our growth in enrollment and additional programs.

We want to ensure we look forward and carefully consider the building needs for the future at each campus location. Our first priority will be to consider future construction at the main campus in Melbourne. To properly support record-setting enrollment and additional programs, we have been hiring additional faculty and staff to properly serve our students' needs. This can be tiring for our hiring committees, but it is critical to our success and their efforts are extremely important, and appreciated!

Another exciting initiative at Ozarka is the partnerships that we continue to develop with four year institutions as we strive to establish a 'University Center' in Melbourne. In the near future this will result in Bachelors and Masters Degree offerings at the Melbourne campus for our alumni and for members of the community wishing to continue their education. We are aware that many people are unable to relocate to a four year college or university and we and our four year institution partners feel that this is an exciting new opportunity. Arkansas State University is presently seeking approval to offer a bachelors degree in business at Ozarka College as soon as the fall semester. Look for additional information on this in the near future.

Ozarka College Director of Financial Aid, Laura Lawrence, who serves as Chair of the Izard County Single Parent Scholarship Committee, explains the purpose of the scholarship. "This program is designed to provide single parents in Izard County the opportunity to pursue a diploma or a degree from a postsecondary school in order to improve their job skills, become self-sufficient and improve the lives of their families."

We want to find every resource possible to help them fulfill their needs in order to alleviate some of the financial burden of obtaining a degree."

Applications are currently being accepted for upcoming Summer and Fall semesters. To be eligible, a student must be a resident of lzard County and the single head of household with a child under the age of 18 in the home. Applicants must also be high school or GED graduates.

Applicants should demonstrate evidence of financial need and plans of pursuing a career-oriented course of study. Applications are available in the Financial Aid Office at Ozarka College in Melbourne. As long as a student applies by May 2, 2011, their application will be considered for summer and/or fall semesters.

The GED Test will be given at Ozarka College in Melbourne, Arkansas on April 7 and 20 at 8:30 a.m. in Room 516 of the Wyth Duke Adult Education Building.

The test will also be given at the following locations in April:


