PARDON OUR PROGRESS...

If you haven't dropped in at the Carpenter Technical Center (CTC) lately, chances are you won't recognize the technical training hub in Ash Flat. Ozarka's collection of exceptional talent is at it again. For months the CTC has been constantly changing. As of June, contractors have been transforming the remaining lab space into the new Machining and Welding Labs. Also, thanks to the continued efforts of the Ozarka maintenance and information systems teams, many upgrades have been made along the way. The Ozarka team made improvements which include (a) remodeling space for a testing center, (b) building a security fence for Automotive's vehicles and equipment, and (c) installing a communications tower on site for high-speed internet.

Dedicated Ozarka faculty and staff did not let renovation stand in the way of offering advanced technical training. In the meantime, the CTC team setup a temporary lab space for Machining and Welding classes. We give special thanks to Marcus Orf (CTC director), Todd Smith (machining faculty), Brad Holzhauzer (welding faculty), and Marty McFarlin (maintenance director) for ensuring Ozarka students and their education never skipped a beat.
